
10 Ways to Build Community

Community relationships, when built with care and concern for the good of the commons, offer a comforting, nourishing, and collegial safety net when times get tough.

3) Time Banks—Organized tools to exchange time are emerging as an excellent local way to share resources with others nearby.

This model is built on the sharing economy where time, or the “person-hour,” is used as currency.

Members receive and provide gifts of time and talent with other members of the exchange. The banking software “tracks” your hours and allows you to access someone else on a need that you have: typical time-banking activities include house-painting, moving, home improvement, gardening, babysitting, elder care, computer advice, and other similar tasks. You can even volunteer to teach a skill, like carpentry and knitting, or a language.

"With New Voices" – Adult Study

A Lenten Journey through Luther's Small Catechism

Our Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton has written that Lutherans have an important and traditional way of communicating faith from generation to generation. Since the time of the Reformation, Martin Luther's Small Catechism has been, and continues to be, a central part of faith formation in our families and our congregations.

Bishop Eaton has invited all of us across the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to study the catechism in this 500th Reformation anniversary year, which she points out is a very good time for adults to look again at the basics of the faith.

Here at Grace a six-week study of the Small Catechism will be led by Bishop Main and Pastor Verkouw. It will take place Sunday mornings throughout the Lenten season, beginning on Sunday, March 5th and concluding on Palm Sunday, April 9th. Sessions will be held from 9:00 AM – 10:15 AM in the auditorium.

The study will consider the time in which Luther lived, wrote, and preached. Together the group will look at and reflect upon our basic statements of faith and our sacraments: the Ten Commandments, the Apostles' Creed, the Lord's Prayer, the Sacrament of Holy Baptism, and the Sacrament of Holy Communion.

Whether you remember memorizing Luther's explanations in his catechism from your childhood or come to it with new eyes, this course offers an opportunity to talk about the breadth and depth of the faith held by Lutherans and other Christians throughout the world. You are encouraged to make it a part of your Lenten journey.

March 5, 2017 (1st Sunday in Lent, Year A)

“But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died through the one man's trespass, much more surely have the grace of God and the free gift in the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, abounded for the many.”

Romans 5:15

Stewardship is the proper care and use of all the gifts God gives us. In the verse above, Paul twice refers to God's mercy through Jesus a “free gift,” and in the full Romans passage for today he uses the phrase “free gift” five times! Do you think he wanted us to get the message? How do we best use and care for God’s “free gift” of mercy and grace through Jesus?
