Tips for going green in 2018!

Electronics and Appliances

- 1. Stop the drain: Certain electronics such as gaming systems, computers and chargers — can draw electricity even when not in use. So plug these items into power strips that are turned off between uses.
- 2. Charge sensibly: Most cell phones require only a few hours to reach a full charge and don't need to be plugged in all night while you sleep.

- 5. Reach for the stars: While not at all saying you need to purchase and install new appliances, electronics or other household items, doing so presents an excellent opportunity. If something breaks or has just run its course, make sure to look for ENERGY-STAR rated items when replacing.
